We are in the season of Lent. Lent remembers the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing himself to do what God sent him into the world to do. In the wilderness, Jesus encountered the Devil. Traditionally we have been taught that the Devil was tempting Jesus to abandon who he was and his mission. But the thing is the Devil wasn't really tempting Jesus. The Devil was describing how the world operates and we operate as well. If you take Jesus out of the story, many would look at what the Devil is describing as being those things you have to do to be successful in the world.

One of the problems with Lent is understanding why Jesus was sent into the wilderness in the first place. We have been taught that Jesus was sent into the world to prepare him for his mission which was to die on the cross so that you and I can be saved from our sins. That's only part of it. Jesus was sent into the broken world not just to die for it but to change it. And that is what Jesus started doing after he left the wilderness. He began challenging the way the world and people operated. He started with the people that he spent much of his time with, people who were, for whatever reason, left out and marginalized. Because Jesus challenged the way the world and people operated he was eventually arrested tired and crucified on a cross.

I do believe that Jesus died on the cross to save us from our sins. The result for many is that his death allows us the privilege of entering heaven after we die instead of spending eternity in hell. For many that is where their faith and understanding of Christianity ends. But there is so much more. Jesus' death and resurrection frees us from our bondage of sin and death that keeps us from loving our neighbor and changing the way the world and people operate.

I believe that the last thing the Devil wants is for Jesus and for you and I to change the way the world and people operate. I think that one of ways the Devil stops this from happening is by allowing us to focus on the part of the story that only talks about Jesus defeating him and temptation. It's clear from the story that we don't have the power of Jesus and so we should do everything we can to avoid temptation. Avoiding temptation means avoiding how the world and people operate. Avoiding how the world and people operate means we avoid doing what Jesus came into the world to do and that was to change and transform so it becomes more in line with God's Kingdom of love and inclusion. And so Lent becomes a time of following Jesus while avoiding the world and its temptation.

My point is we may spend time avoiding temptation and thus avoiding the world but what in our lives has changed. We may use this time to follow Jesus and our faith that he has saved us from our sins but what has changed. One of the reasons why more and more people are not going to church anymore is that they feel like there is no change in their lives. They feel like the church is more concerned about temptation and fear and personal salvation than it is in giving people the encouragement and faith that their lives can change as a result of their faith in Jesus. How many people are going to church services today and experiencing little or no change in their lives?

My hope is that during Lent we will feel like our lives can change and not that we are avoiding temptation but rather that we are getting closer to God's transformative love and grace in our lives. My hope is that we can leave church feeling like we have the faith and tools to not only stand up to the Devil but live confidently in spite of how the world and people operate. We can leave church feeling like we have a place where we belong and where we can turn to find the help and support for the challenges that we all face. The challenge of changing this world and people for Jesus.
