We all go through times that test our faith. And after we go through them and life gets back to normal, we appreciate that despite the pain and inconvenience we went through, God was with us every step of the way. It is like the famous poem, Footprint In the Sands says, "At those times when you didn't see my footprints, it was when I was carrying you."

The difficult part of going through difficult times is dealing with the changes that have occurred. The hardest question we have to answer is "What did you learn from the experience?" The answer to that question is important, because it marks the beginning of a new way forward in our lives and in our faith. My experience with people is they either move forward with resentment, anger and pain or they move forward with hope and forgiveness. I think that through this Pandemic and coming out of it as we now are that there are a lot of people who are letting resentment and anger guide their way forward. This resentment and anger is only made worse by being stoked by all the negative events happening in the world: Inflation, the price of gasoline, mistrust in our leaders and government, the war in Ukraine. The list goes on and on.

Of course, what we are going through now is nothing new. People have been going through this cycle for millennia, Through it all, the church has been there to give people hope and direction in their lives, especially in answering that difficult question "What have you learned." Think for a moment about what the early church was like. In the book "After Jesus, Before Christianity: A Historical Exploration of the First Two Centuries of Jesus Movements" the authors (one of which was a former professor) talk about how there was no formal church but instead pockets of people living in different parts of Palestine who shared in a belief in Jesus as the Messiah. They would gather at a time when Roman oppression and cruelty were at its zenith. Believers were dying all the time. They could have easily learned from that difficulty to go forward in anger, resentment and hate; and resign themselves to the suffering they were experiencing. But they created hope. They stood up to evil and death by taking the story of a Jewish carpenter and teacher who suffered a horrible and unjust death and with the help of the Holy Spirit transformed that story to one of resurrection and new life, thus giving the world and us a new direction to live. A direction filled hope and love and community and the Kingdom of God.

One of the scriptures I recently preached on was the Parable of Good Samaritan in Luke 10. We all are familiar with the story of how a man was robbed and beaten and left for dead by the side of the road. The sight of the man in the ditch however didn't stop the traffic. People walked on by, going on their way. But a Samaritan, someone whom we know was supposed to be an outcast and who was always

treated as scum and less than worthy of care, saw the man and helped. Despite his own difficult circumstances he stopped and helped the man and thus started a new way and direction for us to follow.

That parable helps gives this church the general direction we should be going. We are all in some way beaten and hurt. But we are also a people of hope who have learned the hard way that God is with us all the time and especially the hard ones. We, like that Samaritan, are called to create and help people follow a new path for people during and after their difficult

# A Reminder to Keep Giving Current This Summer

Our Mountain View UMC enters this summer in a healthy financial position, thanks to members who are current on their 2022 commitments to giving. To date, non-pledged giving is on target with our projections. Careful spending has been held within budget. As of this past month, cash flow is

adequate to meet current obligations. Your giving and our expense management has been commendable.

I ask that you continue to keep your financial support of the church strong during the summer and fall months. You can do this in several ways: 1) give during worship at least one Sunday a month when you are in worship and not traveling; 2) set up a monthly draft for electronic transfer so that you don't have to remember to write the check while you are away; or 3) set up an automatic payment through your own bank to the church on a regular schedule. Our Financial Secretary (who handles all income), Jerry Burnham, will be glad to help you privately with any of these last two methods.

Summertime ministry expenses do not end while members are on vacation. The mission of the Church continues. In fact, as our ministry teams and age-level ministries gear up for the fall, we will have additional expenses to cover in July and August. Your finance leaders appreciate your dedication.






