




Teller and adjoining counties to promote the well-being of seniors;

As of July 12, 2013, the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Woodland Park Senior Organization is recognized by the IRS as a 501c3 non-profit organization. Donations are tax deductible to the full extent of the law.

### HISTORY OF THE SENIOR CENTER BUILDING

This information was provided by the Ute Pass Historical Society by information from old newspaper clippings. The original group of seniors that formed the Club we know today met for the first time as a Club on July 12, 1973 in Faith Lutheran Church in Woodland Park, Colorado. In 1977, the city donated an old abandoned “wreck of a building” that at one time was a feed store and home for the VFW. The building was renovated with money from a federal grant and private donations. The Club took occupancy of the building in 1978 and the Senior Center was open for business. In 1993, the kitchen had to be modernized to meet the health codes so they could continue to serve meals. Various additions and renovations have been made in the following years to give us what we have today – the Woodland Park Senior Center – home for the Woodland Park Senior Organization.

The Worship Team at MVUMC is responsible for three areas that affect the worship services:

- **Technology:** Provides the video, sound equipment and streaming for YouTube broadcasts.
- **Music:** This includes the choir, bell choir, summer bell choir, soloists, instrumentalists, vocal quartet, and Changing Hearts group.
- **Sanctuary care:** Decorating for seasons of the church services (Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas) and other occasions as necessary, care and cleaning of the altar paraments, banners, communion and other special events. Organizing volunteers as ushers communion servers, liturgist, altar flowers, memorial and funeral services.




