#### ... a people of God, learning to love like Jesus

Sunday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> is Pentecost this year. Pentecost is the third "highest" Holy Day of the Christian Calendar, one that marks a major milestone in the life of the church – the coming of the Holy Spirit to empower its ministry to the world. That's the theory at least: but in practice, at least compared to Christmas and Easter it has become almost an afterthought. Sure, we put up the red decorations, and some of us wear read as well. Maybe we even read the Pentecost story in a different language or even a variety of languages once in a while. But overall I don't know of too many churches with major Pentecost traditions. I don't know too many Christians who make a point of not missing church on Pentecost Sunday either.

Part of it is timing of course: Pentecost often coincides with Memorial Day weekend (as it does this year), or Graduation Sunday, or the beginning of summer vacation – all events that lower church attendance. But it doesn't help that the subject of the day – the coming of the Holy Spirit – is a difficult one for us to wrap our modern minds around. How do we relate to this spectacle: Gusts of wind, tongues of fire, almost three thousand people baptized in one day? It makes an exciting story, but we don't often see that kind of outpouring these days. And even if something like that DID happen - how would we react?

I have to confess that the first time I was in a church and someone started speaking in tongues it all seemed so strange that my impulse was to re-locate, not to rejoice! I've wondered if I was wrong for feeling that way - if my discomfort with "miraculous" events like speaking in tongues was a sign of something lacking in my faith. Is it wrong that I don't expect the Spirit to work in my life in that way? Am I missing the Holy Spirit at work?

Then I look back at the rest of the book of Acts, and realize that while the miracles present, they aren't the point. It's called "The Acts of the Apostles" for a reason; most of the book isn't about miraculous acts of the Spirit: it's about the faithful acts of those who follow Jesus. It's about people sharing their gifts, their food, their time, their worship (Acts 2:43-47). It's about people taking care of one another as best suits their abilities (Acts 6:3-6) and opening themselves up to new ideas about others (Acts 10). It's the work of the Holy Spirit, but mostly about the way that Spirit works through believers, not just on them or around them.

And with those eyes, I realize that I see the Holy Spirit at work in powerful ways all the time:

- In small groups that gather to study scripture together.
- As people gather share their talents in worship.
- At community meals, where volunteers prepare and serve food for strangers and friends and strangers who become friends.
- As other volunteer to work at food banks, with Habitats for Humanity, with Help the Needy, and a variety of other groups.
- in offering gifts and tithes to support the work of the church local, regionally, and globally and in other donations for outreach across the area.
- in prayers, raised up in public and an private, both for the healing of our broken world and in praise of the ways we have seen God's healing power at work.

Maybe the problem isn't a lack of the Spirit in my faith, maybe it's in failing to recognize the Spirit when I see it – not in the rare spectacles, but in the everyday life of faithful people following the "the Way" of Jesus Christ together.

Hope to see you in worship on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, as we celebrate Pentecost, and anticipate the ways Holy Spirit will continue to move and use us in the days and weeks to come!





- (1) Pledged revenues were under budget for the month by \$2,388 but over budget for the year by \$6,503.
- (2) Unpledged revenues were over budget for the month by \$1,277 and over budget for the year by \$4,525.
- (3) Expenses were under budget for the month by \$3,611 and under budget for the year by \$10,667.
- (4) Operating Fund Net Cash flow was negative \$3,656 for the month but better than budget by \$21,652 for the year.
  Major increase in Operating Net Cash Flow was due to income from PPP #2 of \$25,198 received in January.
- (5) Combined cash has increased this year by \$27,050, mainly due to the \$25,198 PPP #2 funds.

Without the PPP #2 funds, combined cash flow would have been positive \$1,852.
