Deputies will put your address on their regular patrols that are checked 24/7.

# February Special Communion

## 2025 Year in Review

The older adults that TSC help appreciate your generous donations and support. You make our important work possible. Your support is a blessing that is helping older adults continue to live in this Community they love.

Teller Senior Coalition (TSC) assisted 957 older adults (age 60 or over) so they can live with independence and dignity and stay in their homes.

From January 2025 through December 2025 Teller Senior Coalition:

- Provided 12,521 door-to-door transportation trips, taking 531 seniors and residents to medical appointments, to buy groceries, and other essential purposes. TSC has a fleet of 14 vehicles, 9 of which are wheelchair accessible.
- Provided 1,327 hours of case management, understanding our client's needs and solutions.
- Provided 63 hours of safety related handyman support, installing grab bars, railings.
- Provided 1,394 hours of homemaker services, keeping homes clean and healthy.
- Delivered 60 Thanksgiving Holiday meals.
- Key Food Pantry in Teller County providing food during suspension of Snap benefits/ government shut-down. Worked with County Officials to provide 1,802 bags of supplemental food, 91 food bags for the local elementary school students, and 9,954 boxes of Home delivered meals for homebound seniors.
- Facilitated \$10,477 heating assistance to low-income residents through CO Energy Outreach.
- Facilitated \$25,057 rent and mortgage support to low-income struggling residents.
- TSC held Social Activities (Bingo, Coffee and Donuts) and monthly trips to local attractions (averaging 47 participants per month) so seniors could interact with peers and have fun.

One senior wrote "You guys are the greatest. The services you provide are needed by so many. Thanks for all you do."

For some seniors, we are their family, an advocate ensuring they receive all the support they need. Many seniors have limited financial resources, making the care we provide so important to their well-being. Our seniors say thank you for caring about their welfare.

## Tips to Drive Safely

Maybe you already know that driving at night or in bad weather is a problem for you. Some drivers also have problems with certain routes or driving on busy highways. Consider these tips to help you make safe choices about driving:



- **Talk with your doctor.** If you have any concerns about your health and driving, see your doctor. Don't risk hurting yourself or others.
- **Be physically active.** This will help you keep and even improve your strength and flexibility which may help your driving abilities.
- **Consider your car.** If possible, drive a car with automatic transmission, power steering, power brakes, and large mirrors. New cars come equipped with back-up cameras which can make parking and backing up easier, as well as other sensor that can alert a driving to a nearby object or vehicle before an accident occurs.

- **Take care of your eyes and ears.** Always wear your glasses or contact lenses if you need them to see clearly. If you use hearing aids, be sure to wear them while driving.
- **Avoid driving certain times of day.** Cut back on or stop driving at night if you have trouble seeing in the dark. Try to avoid driving during sunrise and sunset, when the sun can be directly in your line of vision.
- **Check in with yourself.** Don't drive if you feel lightheaded or drowsy. Be sure to check any warnings on medications. Try to avoid driving when stressed or tired.
- **Don't crowd.** Leave ample space between your car and the car in front of you and start braking early when you need to stop.



- **Plan your timing.** Avoid heavy traffic areas or rush-hour driving when you can.
- **Plan your route.** Drive on streets you know and find a way to go that requires few or no left turns. Choose a route that avoids highways or other high-speed roadways. If you must drive on a fast-moving highway, drive in the right-hand lane where traffic moves more slowly.
- **When in doubt, don't go out.** Bad weather, such as rain, ice, or snow, can make it hard for anyone to drive. Try to wait until the

weather is better, or use buses, taxis, ridesharing services or other alternatives.

- **Wear seat belts.** Always wear your seat belt and make sure your passengers wear theirs too!
- **Limit distractions.** Eating, adjusting the radio, or chatting can all be distracting. If you use your cell phone while driving, use it hands-free and use voice activation when possible. Never type on your phone while driving.
- **Use window defrosters.** These will help keep windows and windshields clear.
