A wise person said to me once that the church was her sanctuary from the worries and concerns of the world. There is a lot going on in the world. But then again there has always been a lot going on in the world. When there is a storm, we seek shelter. When there is danger, we seek safety. God created us and in God's wisdom placed those basic needs within all of us. Some might say they are selfish, but think what would happen if everyone didn't seek shelter or safety and they all died. There would be no left.

One of things that I admire about people of faith is that when they seek shelter and safety, they don't just do it for themselves, they will make sure that there is shelter and safety for others, especially those who need help. I made mention the other week in my message about the church creating little islands of paradise in the midst of a bigger and darker world where people were left on their own.

That was pretty much the case when Jesus arrived. People were pretty much on their own. How well they did was determined by what resources they had. As always, people with resources and who followed the commandments did well. The rest struggled and were often ostracized by the Pharisees. Remember the Pharisees were about obeying the commandments and many of them had to do with the cleanliness and the food people ate and how it was prepared. Most could not afford the food much less do what was necessary to follow the commandments. They were on their own.

Jesus came and said to the world, you are not on your own. You are part of God's Kingdom. In Luke 4; 18-19, Jesus proclaims.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, To preach the acceptable year of the Lord..."

And so from that time on Jesus began to create these little islands of the Kingdom of God for people to find shelter and safety amidst a world that said you are on your own. After His death, resurrection and ascension he passed that task on to the Disciples. As Christians, we are to be like Christ and build a little island of the Kingdom of God not only where we can find shelter and safety for ourselves but also a place where others can find it too.

This past week, the world lost Pope Francis. While he was the head of the Roman Catholic Church, he was an example for all the world about being like Christ and building little islands of God's Kingdom for people to find shelter and safety. As large as the Roman Catholic Church is and as complicated their doctrines and rules are, he always made people important.

He guessed right that people are important to God. That is why we make these little islands of paradise or the Kingdom of God because in the end people are what is important. God sent his son into the world so that no one, no matter who they are or where they come from, what sexuality, what economic status or political affiliation they may be, should have to go at it alone. That is why we have each other and the Church.

Additionally, we are partnering with East United Methodist Church in Colorado Springs with this appointment. Mountain View will be at about 75% and East at 25%. Very soon, our Mountain View leadership will work with East UMC leadership to determine more of the logistics for managing this partnership.

Most importantly, I and the other members of the SPRC are excited at the spirit and genuine enthusiasm that Pastor Ingrid displayed with us in our meeting.

A little additional background on Rev Ingrid:

She is "All in on grace, the Way of Jesus Christ, and the ongoing evolution of the United Methodist Church." She is the mother of three adult children and a 16-year-old son (plus 2 dogs), first U.S. born child of Cuban refugees. An outdoor enthusiast, and she loves sharing the good news that God is with us and for us and invites us to join in the work of the Kingdom.

Pastor Ingrid is an Elder in the Texas Conference of the UMC, and coming to Colorado from Lake Palestine UMC in Chandler, Texas. Please pray for God to bless Ingrid during this move and time of transition.

As noted in the statement from Bishop Kristin on this appointment: "East and Mountain View are each poised to write the next chapter in their stories as faithful witnesses to Jesus Christ's gracious presence in Colorado Springs and Woodland Park."

To this end, Pastor Ingrid says:

"I have experienced amazing grace from God. I strive to share that love by walking with others in the way of Christ. I love sharing the good news that God is with us, and God is for us, and I love helping people live into that reality."

We will continue to keep everyone informed as we move forward in this exciting transition.





away you go! Please note that there are costs involved with on-line donations. If you use a credit card, there is a 1.5% base Donorbox charge plus a 2.9%+\$.30 credit card charge. If you use checking account information, there is only the 1.5% base Donorbox charge.



We saw a strong rebound in donations in March and ended up with a positive total funds flow year to date of just above \$20,000. As you can see from the attached graphs, both general donations as well as RTBG donations are ahead of target.

Even though we have still some ways to go, I feel that we have a very good chance to close the budget gap for 2025.

Holly's daughter, Maddy was diagnosed with arthrogryposis and hearing loss at birth, and Holly became interested in adaptive riding after hearing about it at a conference. Stephanie had been involved in many non-profit equine assisted

programs since 2003 and was pursuing instructor certification when the two women met at church and quickly realized that they had the same vision – to bring adaptive equine assisted services to Teller County, Colorado. The idea of FHELC was born, and the two got to work immediately putting the vision into reality.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- FHELC gave its first lessons in January 2020 in Holly's backyard barn, with one horse, one pony, and six clients. The program quickly outgrew Holly's backyard despite Covid shut downs.
- In November 2021, almost two years later, FHELC moved into a 12,720 square foot indoor equestrian facility on a 126-acre historic ranch, complete with outdoor arenas and access to national forest trails.
- In 2022, FHELC became a PATH International Center member, being the only PATH center in a 70-mile radius offering 6 different Equine Assisted Services.
- By end of year 2023, FHELC has served over 350 clients, is home to 12 horses, partners with 5 local schools and many other community organizations, and utilizes over 60 volunteers who have logged over 6000 hours of service.

- **Technology**: Provides the video, sound equipment and steaming for YouTube broadcasts.
- **Music**: This includes the choir, bell choir, summer bell choir, soloists, instrumentalists, vocal quartet, and Changing Hearts group.
- **Sanctuary care**: Decorating for seasons of the church services (Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas) and other occasions as necessary, care and cleaning of the altar paraments, banners, communion and other special events. Organizing volunteers as ushers communion servers, liturgist, altar flowers, memorial and funeral services.

Each committee welcomes new volunteers and provides training, call the office or Ann Snipes (720-427-1828), to be directed to a committee. We especially need volunteers for sound booth, ushers, and liturgist.

CERTIFIED LAY SERVANTS

Lay Servant Ministries is one of the most significant lay leadership developments programs already available within the United Methodist connection. Through this system of equipping and empowering, lay servants have the opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ who then go and make other disciples.

Mark 10:45—For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others.

The Certified Lay Servant is:

- An active supporting and professing member of a local church.
- Has the desire to serve the church.
- Is well informed on—Scripture, doctrine, heritage, and the organization of the United Methodist Church.
- Receives training through their district or conference to develop their skills in witnessing the Christian faith.
- Serves in the local church / charge and beyond, using their spiritual gifts to inspire others to a deeper commitment to Christ and more effective discipleship.
- Is equipped through continued study and training to lead, assist, and support the mission and ministries of the church.

Lay servants have a wide range of functions both in the church and the community



To become a Lay Servant, you must:

- Obtain the recommendation of your pastor or church council or charge of the local church in which you hold membership.
- Complete the Basic Course and an Advanced Course
- Submit an annual report via your charge conference
- Is renewed as an Advanced Lay Servant with the approval of their pastor
- Complete an Advanced Course every three (3) years
- May preach at their local church with the coordination and approval of their pastor

You are not required to be a Certified Lay Servant to take a Basic or Certified Lay Servant Course. Anybody with a desire to receive training in an area of interest to them may take the course and receive a Certificate of Completion. Additionally, it is not necessary to take the Basic Course before taking an Advanced Course; Certified Lay Servants simply need to have completed both courses. Should a Certified Lay Servant lose his / her standing by failing to take an Advanced Course within a three year period, the individual may regain standing as a Certified Lay Servant by taking an Advanced Course and repeating the application process to renew as a Certified Lay Servant. The Book of Discipline does not mandate repeating the Basic Course.
