

Grace and peace in the name of Christ to the people called United Methodist of the Western Jurisdiction. We are the Mission Cabinet of the Western Jurisdiction, composed of your bishops, Directors of Connectional Ministries, and Leadership Team Chair. We speak to you out of a deep love for Christ and Christ's Church, believing that the church should be "a home for all God's people, gathered around a table of reconciliation and transformation."

It is after much prayer, study and discernment that we share with you that we believe that the One Church Plan is the best way forward for the mission and ministry of The United Methodist Church. We stand with the Council of Bishops in their affirmation of this plan...

As children of God, we have travelled together with Jesus Christ, by the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to a place of full inclusion of all persons in the fellowship and ministry of the Church. We are committed to the full inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the church now and as we move forward.

At the same time, we recognize that the Annual Conferences, clergy, churches, and other ministry settings we serve are not all of one mind about these matters. We affirm our unity in Christ and commit ourselves to living together as one body, though we do not all understand God's will for the human family in the same way.

We believe this plan provides a vision big enough to hold the diversity that grows out of our theological task, creating generous space for us to live faithfully our conscience as we follow Jesus, holding to a covenant of mission that binds us together to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

MOUNTAIN VIEW TO HOLD CONSTRUCTIVE CONVERSATIONS ON HUMAN SEXUALITY BEGINNING OCTOBER 21 & 22

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet in February of 2019 to discuss recommendations from our denominational Commission on a Way Forward regarding our denomination's current position on homosexuality. A recent survey of our own congregation discovered some differences of opinion regarding greater inclusion of homosexual persons in the life of the church while 28% of our congregation also indicated an interest in studying the issue further. To facilitate healthy conversation within our congregation, a series of Constructive Conversations on Human Sexuality will begin on Sunday/Monday October 21/22 and run weekly for four weeks, with each Monday session repeating the content of the previous Sunday session. These sessions will seek to create a safe place for members to discuss the issue of homosexuality in light of church teaching and denominational actions. The sessions will not seek to persuade persons to adopt a particular opinion on the matter, but will rather endeavor to promote unity over uniformity and understanding over agreement. Sunday sessions will occur at 8:45 am in the youth room/old sanctuary. Monday session will occur at 7:00 pm in rooms 105/106. Topics will include the importance of church unity, principles of biblical interpretation, and current views on homosexuality. All are urged to participate. Come with an open mind, a desire to learn, and a commitment to love others - including those whose views may differ from you own - just as Jesus loves them.
