

Dear friends in Christ,

Paul concluded both of his letters to the Corinthians with this instruction: "Greet one another with a holy kiss." (I Corinthians 16:20 and 2 Corinthians 13:12).

My Aunt Grace didn't take everything in the Bible literally. But oh boy, did she believe in these instructions from the apostle! She ALWAYS greeted me with a kiss – right on the lips! Then gave me a tight hug. When I was a young child, I must have thought it was normal, at least, for her. As I got older, it just seemed weird. As a teenager...gross!

I've learned over the years that a side-ways kiss (on either side of the face) is a normal greeting in the middle east, parts of Europe, and other regions of the world. Even with strangers. Greeting each other in some physical way is an important part of many cultures. In our country, it's usually a hug with people we know, or a handshake, that accompanies a verbal greeting.

How we greet each other, and guests, at Mountain View is important. It conveys how we care about others and are interested in their well-being. It's how we genuinely show hospitality.

COVID safety protocols rightly, if regretfully, put the "kibosh" on traditional ways of showing hospitality. It's been a tough year for Mountain View and other community institutions – from picnics to the arts. I'm not sure how my Aunt Grace would have survived these past nearly eighteen months, had she been alive. We've had a hard time, too.

Your various teams, Worship – Invitation – Safety and others, are in discussion about some safe ways we can emerge from some of the protocols, knowing that we will not fully return to "business as usual" when we gather, at least, for quite some time. The Delta and other variants currently are causing new alarms throughout the nation. We want to be safe. I encourage those who need extra precaution to continue use of masks, maintain a responsible distance when talking to each other, and be generous with the use of hand sanitizers.

But with guidance from our health professionals and the State of Colorado, we are taking some steps as a church to create a safe "greeting" environment before and after worship.

One step is to bring back our "coffee hour" in August, or as soon as pots can be updated and hosts to pour coffee can be recruited by the different teams responsible for each month.

Another step is to increase the number of greeters at each of our main entrances. We are welcoming volunteers and encourage you to call the church office to sign up.

Finally, starting in September, we will ask our Communion Stewards to prepare disposable cups and a piece of bread, cracker or wafer that is not bound in those "awful" plastic cups (though we're thankful for the creativity Cokesbury used to keep us safe).

Your team leaders and staff welcome other creative ideas to show hospitality to our guests and to each other! We may not satisfy Aunt Grace and her lipsmacking habits, but we trust that our efforts to have a welcoming presence will be satisfying to God. And that's what matters most.

Notes for June 2021:

- Pledged revenues were under budget for the month by \$3,981 and over budget for the year by \$8,602.
- (2) Unpledged revenues were over budget for the month by \$1,779 and over budget for the year by \$11,750.
- (3) Expenses were under budget for the month by \$4,388 and under budget for the year by \$15,761.
- (4) Operating Fund Net Cash flow was negative \$3,791 for the month but better than budget by \$28,856 for the year. Major increase in Operating Net Cash Flow was due to income from PPP #2 of \$25,198 received in January.
- (5) Combined cash has increased this year by \$23,934, due to the \$25,198 PPP #2 funds. Without the PPP #2 funds, combined cash flow would have been negative \$1,263.
- (6) An extra mortgage reduction payment in the amount of \$1,470 was made in June from Restricted donations.
